## Protect Yourself and Others

The health and wellbeing of students, teachers and volunteer coaches and judges who will be taking part in the Mock Trial Competition ('participants') at the 1903 Supreme Court building is our priority. This is to protect both the participants and others they may come into contact with.

Prior to attending the Mock Trial Competition in person, participants must be aware of the following COVID-19 preventative controls.

## Participation

1. In person attendance will be limited to participants only. No other persons (parents and spectators) may attend and they will not be permitted to enter the building.
2. Participants are not to attend a mock trial if they are exhibiting any symptoms of COVID-19 as follows:

Symptoms of COVID-19 can range from mild illness to pneumonia. People with coronavirus may experience symptoms such as:

- fever
- respiratory symptoms
  - coughing
  - sore throat
  - shortness of breath

Other symptoms can include runny nose, headache, muscle or joint pains, nausea, diarrhoea, vomiting, loss of sense of smell, altered sense of taste, loss of appetite and fatigue.

## Controls

1. All participants will be required to provide contact details prior to entering the building (name, phone number and/or email address). A form to complete for this purpose will be available at the entrance to the building. For students, it is sufficient for an authorised teacher to provide a list of attending students and her/his contact details on the basis the teacher will contact those students if necessary.
2. Participants must comply with any requirements or directions on signage in the building.
3. A maximum of 12 students and 5 adults will be allowed in each courtroom to ensure that physical distancing requirements are met.
4. Hand sanitiser is available in each courtroom.
5. If participants need to use the toilets at the building, they must comply with all directions on signage regarding use of the toilets.
