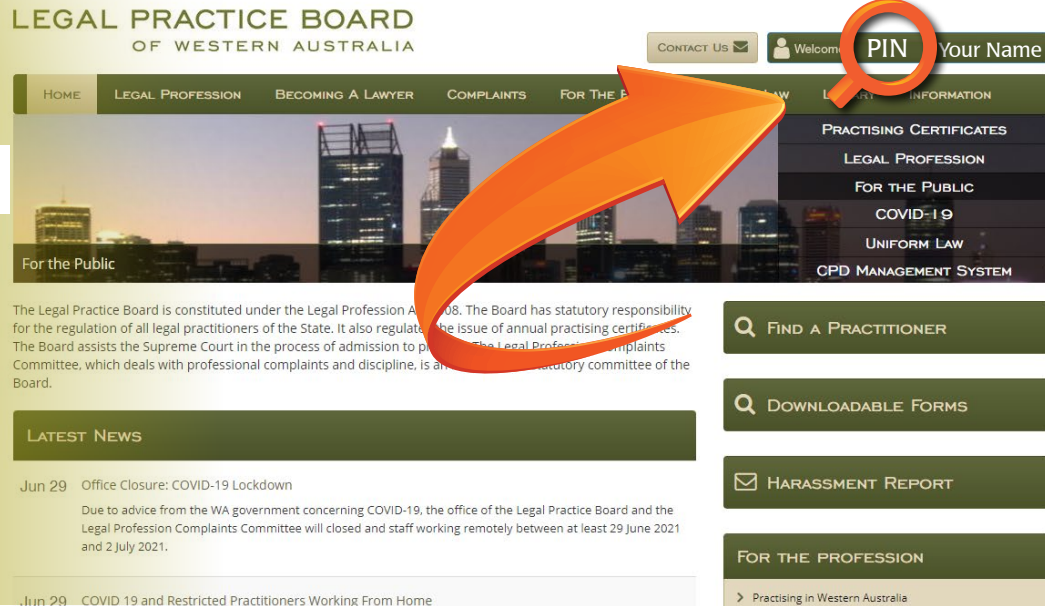


Finding Your Legal Practice Board

PIN



Practitioners who require CPD to maintain their annual practising certificate need to provide the Law Society with their Practitioner Identification Number (PIN) issued by the Legal Practice Board of Western Australia (LPBWA).

To find your PIN, you will need to login to the [Legal Practice Board website](#) using your LPBWA Username and Password. (If you do not have your username or password, use the Forgotten Username/Password options to obtain this information.)

Once you have logged in to the LPBWA portal, your PIN will be displayed next to the “Welcome” at the top right before your name (highlighted in image shown on the right).

The Legal Practice Board advised most practitioners of their PIN on or around 9 March 2021 (via email).

You can email your LPB PIN to the CPD team at cpd@lawsocietywa.asn.au or update it on the [Law Society’s Member Portal](#) by clicking on the “My Details” tab in the top left corner.
